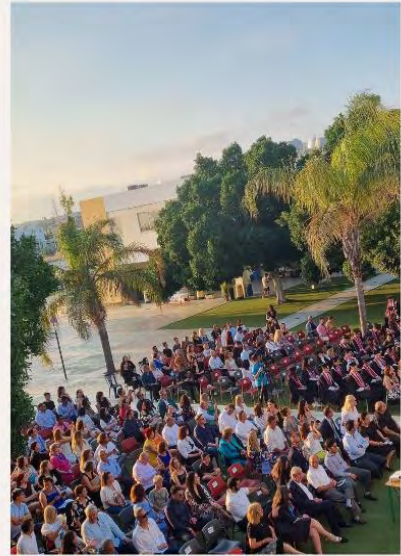

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INTERNATIONAL DAY OF YOGA 2022

ISOPs Environmental Club joined the global call for climate action commemorating the start of this years United Nations Climate Change Conference, which is taking place in Glasgow, Scotland.

On Saturday, October 30th, the Environmental Club did a beach clean-up at Agios Georgios in Peiya. They were confronted with an alarming amount of microplastic, which are tiny pieces of plastic that can be very harmful to marine life. After just an hour, the beach was cleared of recycleables and non-recyclebale items like large pieces of plastic, styrofoam, and much of the beach's microplastic, too. The efforts by our students contributing to a cleaner environment and protecting marine life demonstrates that each small action leads to big, positive change and a hopeful future.

AWARD CEREMONY 2022



The International School of Paphos has been awarded the title 'Eco-School' for the academic year 2021 and 2022, in the 'Green Flag Award Ceremony' that was held on the 21st of June 2021, at the Hellenic Bank Head Office in Nicosia. Our school participates every year, with entries from kindergarten, primary and secondary school. Our Eco-team participation has been hands on, with new creative ideas and projects, which has led us to gain 3 flags! Thanks to the two eco clubs running this year, and the students who participated in a range of projects- activities well worth it! 'Eco-Schools' Programme is a growing phenomenon which encourages young people to engage in their environment, by allowing them the opportunity to actively protect it. It begins in the classroom and expands to the community by engaging the next generation in action-based learning. The Programme is carried out in conjunction with Cyprus Marine Environment Protection Association (CYMEPA) and the Ministry of Education, Culture, Youth and Sports (MOEC) and the active support of Hellenic Bank. All schools have to follow a seven-step change process to be eligible for the title. If the students show improvement in learning, attitude and behaviour towards the environment, the school is awarded the title.

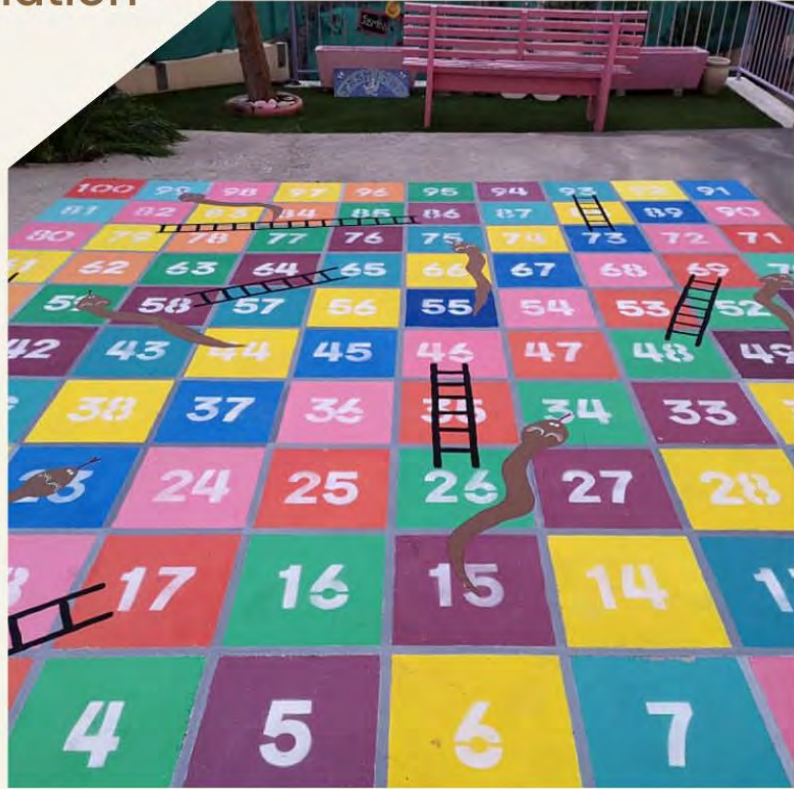

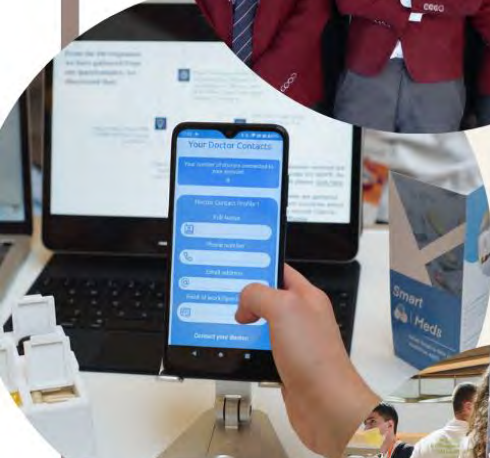


9th Company Programme Trade Fair

The Finale and Awards Ceremony of the Junior Achievement Cyprus (JA Cyprus) Company Programme 2022 was held on Friday, May 6, 2022. The competition was the culmination of the efforts of 400 students, aged 15-18, who created their own student company during the school year. The ten finalists – from the 50 student companies that were created - presented their innovative business ideas in public to a specialised jury committee.

The second place was achieved by JAMICS, from our school. The team created an app, a smart box of pills designed to tackle the problem of forgetting to take your medication at the right time with the right dose. The team was supported by their teacher Mr. Antonis Yiannouros and their mentor Mrs. Kiki Kalli from the Cardet Organisation.

In addition to the main title “Company of the Year 2022” and the 1st and 2nd runner up awards, student companies also received other special awards for their achievements in key areas of business and entrepreneurship. JAMICS received the Most Innovative Award.

ΕΠΙΧΕΙΡΗΣΗ ΤΗΣ ΧΡΟΝΙΑΣ 2022





The JA Entrepreneurship Summit is an intensive “startup boot camp” where high school students are challenged to design ready-to-launch, socially-conscious businesses.

Over the course of five days, students utilise technology to brainstorm and collaborate with peers, access mini-seminars and workshops, and learn from business leaders and trained volunteer mentors. By participating, students develop the technical and soft skills needed to not only become successful entrepreneurs, but also to meet the demands of a rapidly changing economy in a variety of professions and careers.

The 2022 JA Entrepreneurship Summit will be held from July 25th - 29th in Washington DC. Our Yr12 Student Chen He (Jackson) was one of the winners and he will be travelling to the US to participate in the innovation camp.



PANCYPRIAN CYBER SECURITY COMPETITION

The International School of Paphos is proud to have taken part in the Cyprus Computer Society, in collaboration with the CyberMouflons Hacking Community successfully organised the Pancyprian Cyber Security Competition (CCSC 2021) which took place from 1st – 18th of April 2021.

The aim of the competition was to find the country's young talents in the field of cyber security. The competition was attended by 220 people, moral hackers, aged 14 and over, students, soldiers, students, amateurs and professionals in the field.

The competition included 41 different types of challenges in web subjects: reverse engineering, forensics, steganography, cryptography etc. prepared by a group of volunteer mentors.

The International School of Paphos participated with our Yr12 Joseph Modestou who made it to the Top Ten. The Top participants received training to compete against 27 other European countries in Prague in the Pan-European Cybersecurity Competition.

Joseph enjoyed Binary Exploitation mostly, which consists of reverse engineering a program, discovering vulnerabilities in it, and then developing a method to exploit those vulnerabilities to gain control of the system that said program is running on.

Joseph's academic plans is to follow his passion on Computer Science and Cyber Security and apply on Universities and gain a deeper knowledge on Software Development and Cyber Security.

Advice from the Head of IT, Vassoulla Neophytou Savva: "Anyone who wants to follow this path is to be patient as the theory behind it all may look overwhelming, hard to achieve, but slowly, with enough time and persistence, anyone with the right mindset will be able to achieve their goals."

We are proud of our students' achievements and we all want them to be the best they can be.



BEBRAS INTERNATIONAL CHALLENGE ON INFORMATICS AND COMPUTATIONAL THINKING CYPRUS



Alex Enikeev and Kyrillos Vasileiou, students of The International School of Paphos, were awarded First Places in the 12th Pancyprrian Informatics Competition (BebRAS Challenge). The first round took place from the 10th to 23rd of December 2021 and for the second round on the 5th of February. BEBRAS is an international initiative aiming to promote Informatics, problem- solving skills, computational and analytical thinking among school students at all ages. The students practised Computational Thinking during the first term of this academic year.



ROBOTEX CY 2022 COMPETITION

Students from The International School of Paphos participated in the Robotex Cy 2022 competition in Nicosia in June 2022. They used a robot to measure water quality, which they developed with Dr Vivian Petinou from the Science Department and George Kyprianou from WeByte Pliroforiki. Students demonstrated their robot and explained to the judges why water is so critical in Cyprus as shortages of water cause issues with the quality. They also highlighted the advantages of the robot use against traditional methods of data collection. The President of the Cypriot Parliament who was visiting the competition, Mrs Annita Demetriou, spoke to the team at length.

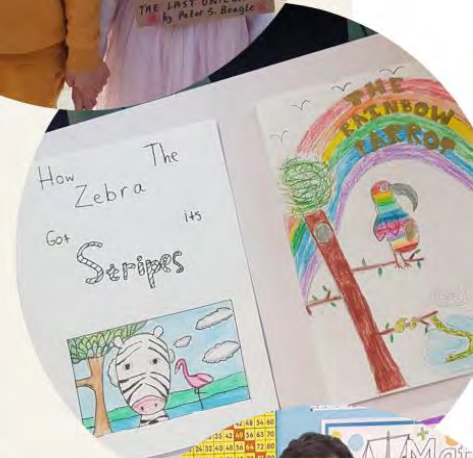
17TH MEDITERRANEAN MODEL UNITED NATIONS

Their hard work, enthusiasm and dedication during the workshop led to their own German theatrical performance on the topic: sustainability and the environment.

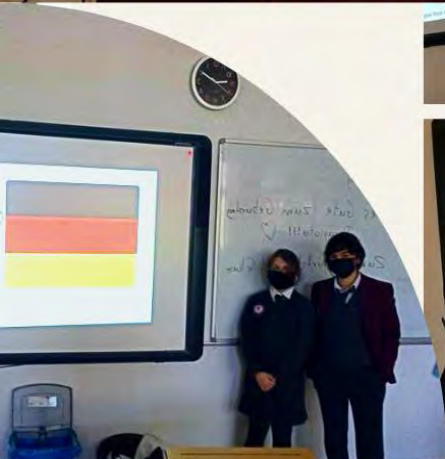
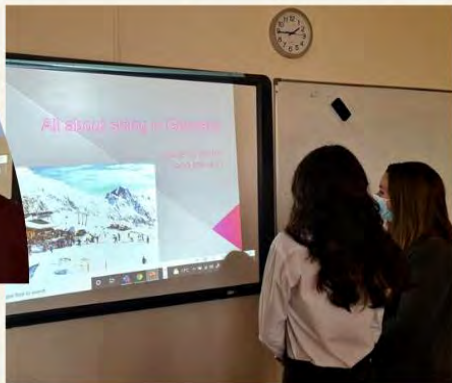
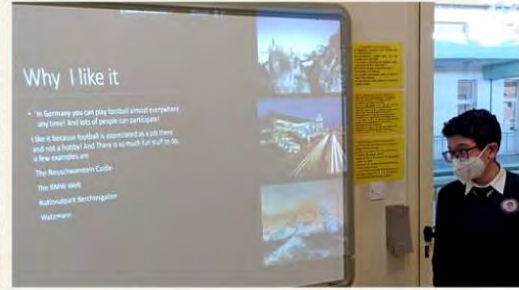

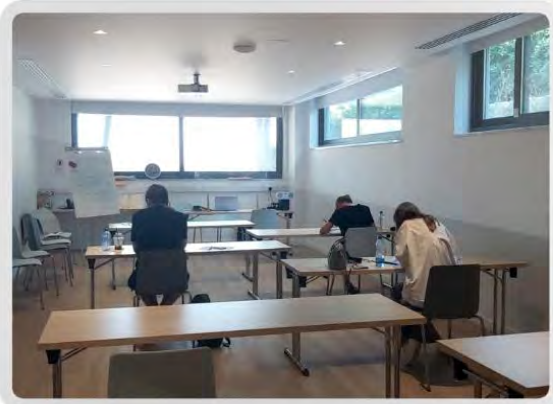


ELLINOMATHEIA EXAMINATIONS

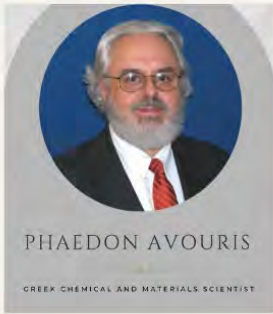

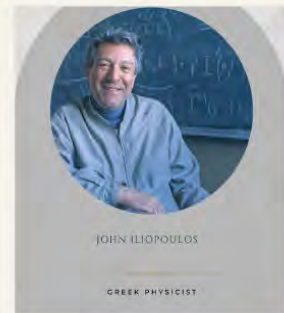

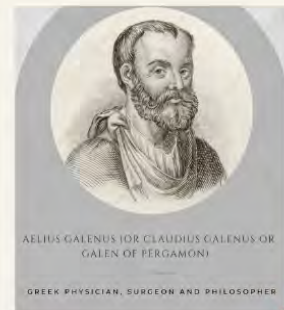
Phaedon Avouris is a Greek Chemical and Materials Scientist who studied at The Aristotle University in Thessaloniki in 1968. After looking at isotope effects in Chemistry, he moved to the USA. He is best known for his contributions to nanoscience and nanotechnology, researching electrical and photonic properties. These contributions are used in technology thus have been valuable.

John Iliopoulos is a Greek Physicist who was born in 1940. He is renowned for his prediction of the Charm Quark which is a sub-particle of the atom. He is also known for presenting the standard model and demonstrating the cancellation of anomalies in this model. His research into theoretical particle physics is admired by many. The work in the standard model describes the fundamental forces in the universe, highlighting their importance.



Hipparchus was a Greek astronomer, considered to be the founder of trigonometry. He was born about 190BC in Nicaea, an ancient Greek city in northwestern Anatolia, but made most of his observations in Rhodes, Greece. He became famous by his discovery of the precision of the equinoxes, having measured many astronomical facts such as the size of the Sun and distance from Earth.

In the Roman Empire Aelius Galenus (also referred to as Claudius Galenus or Galen of Pergamon) was a Greek physician, surgeon and philosopher. He influenced the development of many disciplines including anatomy, physiology, pathology, pharmacology and neurology, as well as philosophy and logic. He was considered one of the most accomplished of all medical researchers. He studied in different parts of the Roman Empire, leaving his mark in significant ways.

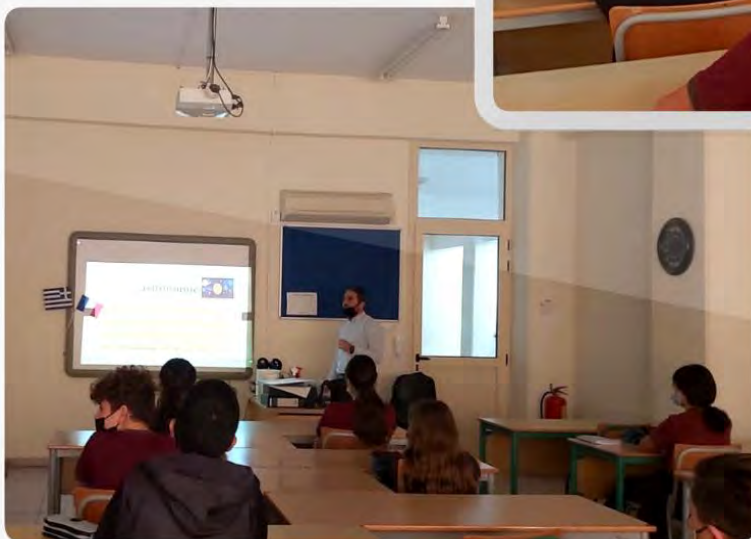
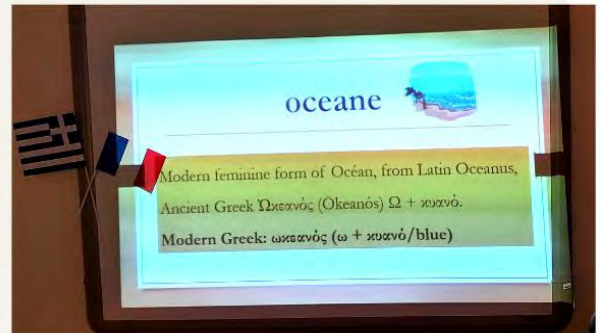
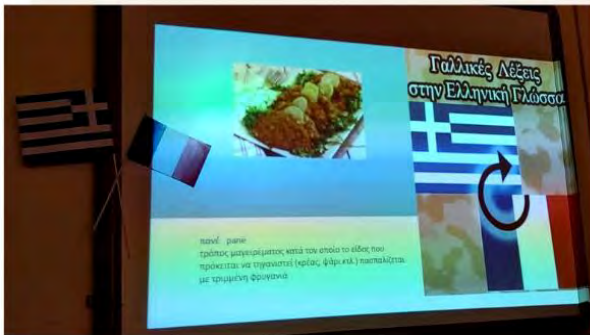

MUSIC CLUB

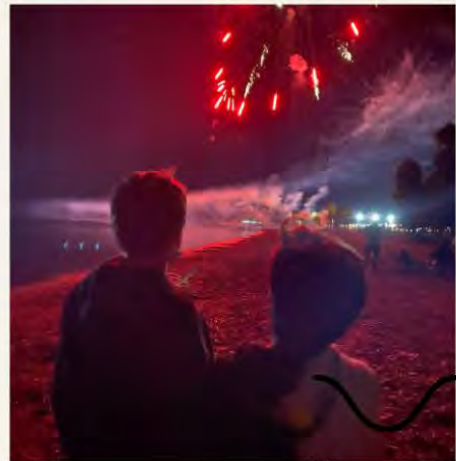

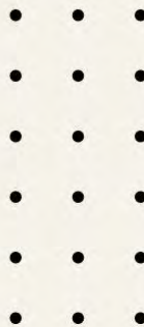
